International Advisory Team for Decommissioning of Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station

As decommissioning of Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station involves technologies unknown by TEPCO and in Japan, experience-based overseas knowledge shall be leveraged in order to safely and efficiently implement the decommissioning plan in accordance with the "Intensive reform implementation action plan" (announced on November 7, 2012). To this end, preparation for establishing an international advisory team (IAT) is ongoing with the cooperation and advice of the government. We will request international organizations such as the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) and the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development Nuclear Energy Agency (OECD-NEA), etc. to provide opportunities to share international knowledge, dispatch peer review mission (the request will be made through the government), etc.



International Advisory Team (IAT)

- Provide advice on technical development necessary for decommissioning
- Give suggestions regarding the overall strategy including the roadmap and the end state
- Provide site-oriented support
- Perform screening of technologies of each country
- Disseminate information to overseas through experts
