## The Energy Situation in Serbia

## 1. Primary Energy Supply

Serbia's primary energy supply amounts to approximately 17,038 ktoe (kilo ton oil equivalent, in 2006) including imports and exports. Less than 80 % of the energy supply is from coal, followed by hydropower and renewable energy such as biomass. Crude oil, oil products and gas needs are met by imports and a portion of the electricity is also imported from other countries. Dependence on energy imports is around 44 %.

## 2. Final energy consumption

Serbia's total energy consumption amounts to approximately 10,285 ktoe (in 2006). Consumption amounts broken down by sector are as follows.
